Tone on Tone fabrics (they should read as solids)

- White
- □ Cream/Peachy buff
- 🛛 Tan
- Medium brown
- Dark brown
- Very dark brown
- Reddish brown/cinnamon
- Rust
- Greyish brown/taupe
- ❑ Very light grey
- Light grey
- Medium grey
- Dark grey
- Very dark grey/slate
- Black
- □ Bright egg-yolk yellow
- Mustard yellow
- Gold
- Bright blue
- Pale blue
- Very dark blue
- Red (tending towards orange, but still red)
- Pale pink (ideally with greyish undertones or even streaks)
- □ Vivid pink like a bright mulberry
- Orange (as needed for specific birds)
- Green (as needed for specific birds)
- □ Purple (as needed for specific birds)

You'll also want some solid black for the eyes.

Prints (streaks, stripes, spots and speckles)

- Cream with darker brown streaks or stripes
- Tan with darker brown streaks or stripes
- Cream or tan with darker brown spots
- Brown with cream speckles
- Darker brown dappled print (all-over floral can work here)
- Lighter brown dappled print (all-over floral can work here)
- Medium brown with darker brown or black streaks or stripes (great for barred wings and tails)
- Grey with black streaks or stripes (great for barred wings and tails)
- Wide black and white stripes (very useful for birds with black and white heads)
- Skinny black and white stripes (mostly for woodpeckers)
- White with black spots
- White with black speckles
- Black with white speckles
- Black and white check (mostly for woodpeckers)
